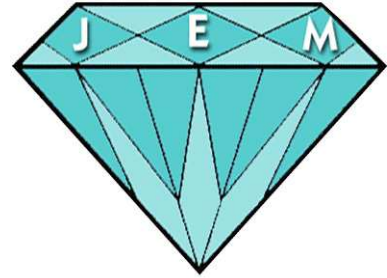


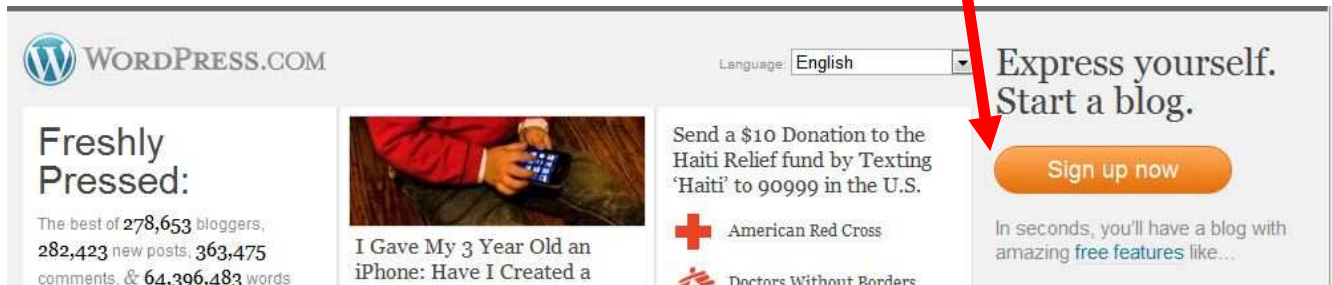

Signing up for a Blog on Wordpress.com



Please read entire document before proceeding with setting
up a Blog on Wordpress.com

Go to wordpress.com.
A window will open. At the top you will see <Sign up now>. Click on



Complete the Username, password, email information and populate the Legal flotsam.

Fill out this one-step form and you'll be blogging seconds later!

Username	<input type="text"/> <small>(Must be at least 4 characters, letters and numbers only.)</small>
Password	<input type="password"/>
Confirm	<input type="password"/> <small>Use upper and lowercase characters, numbers and symbols like !"£\$%^&() in your password.</small>
Email Address	<input type="text"/> <small>(We send important administration notices to this address so triple-check it.)</small>
Legal flotsam	<input type="checkbox"/> I have read and agree to the fascinating terms of service.
	<input checked="" type="radio"/> Gimme a blog! (Like <code>username.wordpress.com</code>) <input type="radio"/> Just a username, please.

Gimme a blog!

Decision time.....what name/Web address?

It generally takes the form of yourname.wordpress.com

Do you want your personal name?

The name of your business?

A duplicate of a Domain Name?

Your own URL (there is a \$15.00 per year fee).

Ask yourself...what is the purpose of the blog?

Note: Once you get a Wordpress.com blog name, that name is no longer available for anyone else, forever.

It is an important consideration if it is to attract or drive traffic to a site later!

If can be just for practice on the Wordpress platform if you anticipate starting a Website based on the Wordpress platform. Then it really does not matter for you can just abandon it later.

Wordpress.org is based on the same platform and can be used for business purposes. But it must be installed on a server or through a Web host. That server or Web host needs full participation in order for you to take advantage of all of the features and options (called plugins a.k.a. add ons).
